- 1. The Act and Regulations are valid for the reasons

- (c) the manner in which the subject matter is treated involves a relationship with other countries or with persons or things outside Australia.
- 3. The subject matter is international in character because:-
 - (a) of its very nature; it is the protection of the world's heritage.
 - (b) the heritage is defined by reference to requirements of "outstanding universal value".
 - (c) the recognition by the international community of a world heritage, and the co-operation of that community for its protection, advances the first object of international relations, namely peace between nations: cf. UNESCO Constitution, Preamble.

- (d) the protection of the world's natural heritage is part of the wider international issue of the protection of nature and the world's natural environment.
- 4. The subject matter affects Australia's relations with other countries because the loss of or damage to part of the world's heritage within Australia:-

- (a) would arouse serious concern and a sense of loss in other countries, and actual loss to those countries with the resulting capacity to affect relations;
- (b) would diminish Australia's standing and influence in the community of nations, at the very least in cultural and environmental matters.
- 5. The manner in which the subject matter is treated involves a relationship with other countries or with persons or things outside Australia because:-
 - (a) the manner of treatment is the enactment of laws to protect the world's heritage;

(b) those laws operate for the benefit of persons both inside and outside Australia in that they protect property of value to all those persons.
